

**SIX STUDENTS RECEIVE
HAZEL MINORITY SCHOLARSHIPS**

Fund awards record \$21,500 to students from the Lower Shore

(AUGUST 13, 2004) --- The Community Foundation of the Eastern Shore has announced \$21,500 in scholarship awards for the 2004-05 academic year to six minority high school and college students from the Lower Shore.

The annual awards are made from the Richard F. and Patricia M. Hazel Minority Teachers Scholarship Fund, one of 62 scholarship funds administered by the Community Foundation.

The scholarship fund was established by the Hazel family of Salisbury in 1991 to support local minority students who plan to teach on the Eastern Shore after graduation from college. Richard F. Hazel formerly owned and operated the Pepsi-Cola Bottling Co. plant in Salisbury for many years.

The six students awarded Hazel Minority Teacher Scholarships this year are:

- Jean Abbott of Crisfield, a 2004 graduate of Crisfield High School, who will attend Worcester Community College;
- Ida Blake of Snow Hill, a student at the University of Maryland Eastern Shore;
- Renita Boone of Salisbury, a student at the University of Maryland Eastern Shore;
- Brandon Marshall of Snow Hill, a 2004 graduate of Snow Hill High School, who will attend Salisbury University;
- Amanda Tillman of Ocean Pines, a student at the University of Maryland College Park;
and
- Terra Taylor of Princess Anne, a student at Salisbury University.
